Holidays at OCC!!



Every year around the holidays, OCC staff and Board Members gather together with the kids at OCC for a family style dinner, artfully prepared each year, by OCC's own Vickie Davis. During this special evening together, our kids get an idea (sometimes for the very first time) that Holidays truly are a celebration. During this time, we honor our Employee of the Year, selected by all the staff at OCC and we even get a visit from Santa & Mrs. Claus who look on as the kids at OCC receive Christmas gifts from their personal wish lists. None of this could happen without the generous outpouring of support our community provides each year.





Arkansas made recent headlines due to higher than average rates of teen nancy in our state. According to the CDC National Center for Unstices, Arkansas ranked number and the CDC National Center for Universities, Arkansas ranked number and the CDC National Center for Universities. pregnancy in our state. According to the CDC National Center for Health Statistics, Arkansas ranked number one in teen pregnancy rates in the U.S. in 2013, with 43.5 babies per 1,000 live births born to teen mothers. This is significantly higher than the national average of 26.5 per 1,000 live births. Factors contributing to this growing issue include transitions and mobility,



inconsistent or failed use of contraceptives, miseducation about reproductive health, family and peer attitudes toward sexual behaviors and pregnancy. According to the National Center for Health Statistics, teen pregnancy rates in Arkansas have continued to rise, despite over 80% of youth reporting they have received some type of reproductive health education in schools. There has been much work done over the past several years to combat this issue, and yet there is still much to be done.

In efforts to help educate youth and curb this and other obstacles, Ouachita Children's Center offers peer groups which address issues common to teenaged males and females. Girls' Circle and Boys' Council are gender specific peer support groups for youth ages 13-18, which provide a structured yet non-threatening environment in which teens can freely express and inquire about various topics including peer relationships, conflict resolution and communication, selfesteem, goal setting, and reproductive health education. These groups are designed to promote the development of healthy living, confidence, courage, honesty, and communication skills.
