The holidays can be stressful for everyone, but when you are a child in crisis and living in an emergency shelter, holidays are not always filled with warm memories or hopeful expectations. Thanks to our incredible community, however, our youth experienced six weeks of holiday comfort and joy!

It all began in mid-November, when First United Methodist Church of Hot Springs invited us to their Thanksgiving dinner. A few days later, our kids were

treated as honored guests to see The Witness at the Hot Springs Convention Center. Right before Thanksgiving, OCC staff shared a "Family Potluck Dinner"

with the kids and a great time was had by all.

With the arrival of December came an amazing army of volunteers who showed up with hearts full of compassion and love, making the holidays much easier on the hearts and minds of our kids. For example, Ms.

OCC Receives Basic Center Grant

We are pleased to announce that OCC has received a three year grant from the Federal Department of Children and Families. This has given us the resources to enhance our existing shelter services, including the hiring of a therapist in order to better meet the psycho-social needs of our children in crisis. The grant is only one part of our larger funding needs, but it helps us to remain true to our mission as a non-profit child advocacy organization that provides emergency shelter and quality services for youth and families, empowering them to achieve lifelong success.

Some have been removed from their homes because of abuse or neglect, some have been court ordered as a last effort to keep them from being incarcerated. Whatever their reasons for being here, they arrive in need of care that will help them to turn their lives around. As you can imagine, OCC staff have their hands full to make this special care happen. In response to the growing needs of our children in crisis, we are developing a comprehensive new volunteer program that will facilitate the mission of OCC and supplement existing programs, activities, and needs.

Sallie Culbreth, our new Public Relations and Volunteer Coordinator, is working

to create a volunteer calendar that gives community volunteers opportunities to do everything from clerical, maintenance, and food preparation, to sports, recreation, elective classes, hair care, and special events support. Offering the Best Care Possible for Youth in Crisis

Every child who comes through the doors of OCC is in crisis. They have experienced trauma and disruption in their young lives that most people cannot even begin to imagine. Some are here because their distress has been expressed through problem behavior, while others are here because they have been removed from their homes due to abuse or neglect. Regardless of the reasons they arrived at OCC, they all have this in common: they need therapeutic, individualized care that will allow them to increase self-efficacy, raise selfesteem, and emerge from this place of temporary emergency shelter with a sense of hope for the future.

LPC, comes in. Her experience in mental health dates back twenty years, providing therapeutic mental health services in a various capacities. She has spent the last thirteen years working with youth in crisis, including children in DYS custody, DCFS custody and parent's custody. She has an extensive clinical background – holding a Master's Degree in Counseling Psychology from Chaminade University of Honolulu. She is a Nationally Certified Counselor, Licensed Professional Counselor in the State of Arkansas, and a lifetime member of the Psi Chi honor society. She has a great deal of experience in program management, staff training and supervision, collecting data for outcome measurements, and assisting with various agency accreditations.

Jackie's impressive abilities, professional experience, and her education will ensure that OCC's continual focus on the therapeutic needs of our youth will be met. She is deeply committed to the effective care of our youth and works with the team to ensure that care is provided.
